

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT: MAY 2024

It's important that local residents know about the work the parish council is doing on their behalf. Parish councils have a number of statutory duties, that is, things that they have to do, and an extensive range of powers, that is, things they are permitted to do if they so wish. In other words, parish



councils have considerable discretion to select what they do, which is why it's important to understand the choices made.

This month's report focuses on the extent to which the parish council addressed its priorities in 2023-24. Next month's report will describe the priorities for the current year.

Governance

• To complete the delivery of induction training for new councillors.

Outcome: some work begun, but incomplete

To regularly consider training opportunities for councillors

Outcome: Only irregular consideration given to training opportunities

To publish an annual report on the work of the council

Outcome: Not completed for 2022-23

Finance

To produce an up-to-date record of parish council assets

Outcome: Completed

• To approve a new policy and guidelines to support the council's desire to give greater publicity to its ability to award grants to local groups and organisations

Outcome: Substantial progress - policy completed, displayed on website, budget for grants increased – more to do to publicize availability of grants

• To make best use of CIL and section 106 funding available to the parish (the neighbourhood portion) and to encourage applications to both funds

Outcome: Developers contribute funds under section 106 or the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) to help increase or improve local facilities. The parish council received £17,336 under Section 106, £7,141 from the Neighbourhood Portion of CIL, which is granted automatically, and successfully applied for £48,500 from the Strategic Share of CIL for the installation of phase 3 of the play equipment.

Planning and the environment

 To ensure that the Neighbourhood Development Plan is used to inform discussion and decisions in relation to planning applications

Outcome: NDP frequently referenced in planning committee meetings

To broaden the remit of the planning committee to include wider environmental issues
 Outcome: Not necessary – environmental issues addressed by new working group

Staffing

 To complete an induction programme for the new assistant clerk to ensure that she is fully operational as quickly as possible

Outcome: Not completed because both assistant clerks resigned shortly after commencing employment.

To ensure that all relevant policies and procedures in respect of staffing have been approved.

Outcome: Completed

Highways & Footpaths

• To continue with the programme of footpath repair and renewal until all the footpaths are of a good standard

Outcome: Much work completed – worst areas tackled – some further work remains

• To make all footpaths as accessible as possible to the widest range of users

Outcome: Improvements to surfaces achieved – attention will now focus on addressing obstacles

• To consider ways in which footpaths and heritage trails within the parish link up with similar in neighbouring parishes.

Outcome: Some progress in establishing links with neighbouring parishes – work to continue

Emergency Planning

• To complete the preparation of an emergency plan for the parish

Outcome: Completed

• To ensure that all emergency wardens are fully trained and equipped

Outcome: Work commenced but not yet completed

External Relations

 To ensure that the new website is kept up to date with relevant information, especially agendas and reports

Outcome: Work in progress

• To consider installing on a trial basis at least one new electronic noticeboard in the parish and to monitor its effectiveness

Outcome: Considered – but no installation

• To consider arrangements to guarantee the future production of Perran News

Outcome: Completed

BECOME A COMMUNITY SHAREHOLDER IN OUR VILLAGE SHOP

Help bring the old shop back to life, have a say in its future and even enjoy the fun of a regular cashprize draw!

Perranwell Community Stores has gone from strength to strength thanks to you, the wonderful residents of our village.

Now our little retail enterprise is taking a big new step – an issue of community shares to enable us to realise our dream of moving into the former Perranwell Stores building at the heart of the village and to put the governance of it firmly in your hands.

Α

s I am sure most residents will know, we opened the Community Stores in a converted container in the car park of the Perran-ar-Worthal Village Memorial Hall in November last year. Thanks to you, we have not only done a roaring trade but also had plenty of fantastic volunteers to run it.

Now the new owner of the former Perranwell Stores is giving us the chance to jump to the final phase of our original plan far more quickly than we could have hoped: to put the village shop back where it belongs. Our plan is to reconstitute the current not-for-profit limited company into a Community Benefit Society. This not only enables us to run the shop in the most tax-efficient way but also to make this a fully collaborative venture by handing ownership over to the community. Throughout we have been advised by the highly respected Plunkett Foundation, which has been supporting community businesses like ours since 1919.

Our goal is to move back into the original location of Perranwell Stores by the beginning of 2025.

So how will it work?

In June 2024, we will be issuing an initial tranche of 250 batches of shares costing £50 each. Shop volunteers and team leaders can purchase shares from June 1st with shares going on sale to everyone else from June 8th. The £12,500 we raise will support the costs of relocating back to the original shop site and funding a part salaried shop manager. Any adult living in the Perranarworthal Parish can purchase one or more shares (maximum of 10), with each shareholder having only a single voting right regardless of how many share batches they own.

In addition, the 109 people who originally donated £50 or more to help the Community Stores project get off the ground will each be offered a complimentary batch of 50 shares.

So why become a shareholder? Unlike regular shares, there is no annual dividend with these and you cannot sell them on to third parties. But there are many great reasons to grab a share or two if you can afford to. Shareholders will:

- Own their own slice of this valued community asset.
- Enable us to realise the dream of reviving the original village shop.
- Vote for the chairperson, director and a committee member running the venture every two to three years, and make other key strategic decisions about the store at twice-yearly shareholder meetings.
- Choose the recipients of an annual Community Improvement Donation we will make to a worthy village cause.

Be entered in a twice-yearly shareholders draw to win a cash prizes of £25 up to £150.

We hope you welcome this chance to play a part in the future of our community store and are excited as we, the current committee, are about putting this precious village service on a firm foundation for generations to come.

Share issue: the essentials

- 250 batches of shares in the new Community Benefit Society (CBS) are being released.
- Shareholders must be residents of Perranarworthal Parish.
- First come, first served!
- Each batch of 50 shares costs £50 (and so comprises 50 x £1 shares).*
- Individuals can buy up to 10 batches.
- They go on pre-sale to current shop volunteers at the current Community Stores from Saturday June 1st and to all the residents of the parish from June 8th. You can pay by cash or card in store only. Please bring proof of your address.
- In addition, those who donated £50 or more when the stores company was originally set up will be offered one complimentary share batch (worth £50). This offer will be communicated in writing during June.
- Each shareholder will receive a certificate of ownership.
- Shares cannot be sold to a third party but may under certain conditions be sold back to the CBS.
- Shareholders will elect the CBS officers for terms of 2-3 years and vote on key strategic decisions.
- A share of profits each year will go to a worthy cause in the village.
- There are no annual dividends but shareholders will be entered in a twice-yearly cash prize draw, with a top prize of £150.
- The 'new' shop will have a part-salaried manager but still be staffed by volunteers.

*Residents might feel that the more logical option would be to offer single shares each costing £50 rather than batches each comprising 50 x £1 shares. But the latter is the recommended approach to receiving FCA regulatory approval which we must have as a Community Benefit Society.

Canon Michael Warner, author of 'A Time To Build', which is a comprehensive review of Cornwall's Anglican Church buildings, will discuss the topic

Stithians Parish Church; A working building through history.

WEDNESDAY 12th JUNE 2024 at 7 pm in Stithians Church. Everyone welcome. Admission free. Donations will be accepted towards the upkeep of the church building, the outhouse, and the graveyards. Tea and coffee and light refreshments will be available for purchase in the church.



This talk was originally proposed for last year, but postponed due to illness.

Michael was the vicar here and Perranarworthal and Gwennap between 1983 and 1993. He took particular interest in the architecture of the churches and their restoration in the 19th century by J.P. St Aubyn.

TAKE ME TO CHURCH

Indeed, it was a 15th century tower at St Piran's church, with evidence of there having been a Norman Chapel on the site beforehand. Our church reached its finished state in the late 19th century. Why did the author feel the ecclesiastical happenings so significant in 21st century Perranwell Station and why rack his brains for explanation? Well, during some rather ill-judged community Facebook posts and comments a year or so ago he'd made frequent allusions to Methodism. Someone had challenged how the hell it was so relevant in 21st century village life. Ironically this was the day before the coronation of King Charles where every other word muttered was that of God with all the swords, orbs and gloves of gods will. The coronation so dripped with seemingly outmoded religiosity that it was difficult to see how Charles could remain serious. Then more recently the author had read a comment on social media, he forgets what the post was about, that said that science and logic had wiped out all feasibility of religious conviction. There was something rather sad and final about this comment that had made it stick with him. Something a little doomsday about it. He thought about it a lot.

It's the philosopher John Gray who brilliantly points out that in the western world we largely declare ourselves as atheists and yet we still plough on in the belief that humanity can "make the world a better place". This is an entirely Christian way of looking at the world.

The author would consider himself atheist in that he felt that praying, in the belief that some all-powerful dude was listening and taking note of what you were saying, is a bit ridiculous. However, the whole ideologies of various religions, coupled with the architecture and artwork, were beautiful.

His grandmother barely missed a service at our village church in her entire life but it was more about the social side than any strong belief in god. She also giggled at male models in the men's underwear section of the old catalogues. The women's lingerie section was a familiar haunt for many a boy of my generation. Anyway, that's a tangent. His Grandfather, a prominent figure in the village during his time, was brought up in a devout Methodist family but would be atheist himself. However, getting to the point here, the author's grandfather would still very much embody the Methodist values of politeness, patience, charity, and peace amongst one's neighbours.

Now of course these values are not exclusive to our village, or in villages as opposed to cities but the author could certainly feel them more keenly in Perranwell Station than other places he'd lived and worked.

"Do not be anxious about anything... and the peace of God which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds" (Philippians 4:6-7)

Anyway the author had other stuff to say about plants, animals and Mother Nature, how in the last article about the war memorial he'd failed to reference the rapper Eminem and the song "Business" etc but he just couldn't expect Dr Gripper to put this claptrap into print every month and he gotta get ready for work, the fair weather is giving way to rain today so hopefully I can park my butt on the digger rather than be laying kerbs and slabs.

TALK GIVEN TO THE PERRANARWORTHAL LOCAL HISTORY GROUP BY LAURA MIUCCI ON 19TH APRIL 2024

An interesting and energetic talk was given by a real enthusiast for her subject. Laura Miucci is Cornwall's Finds liaison Officer and runs the

Portable Antiquities Scheme database. She is based at the museum of Cornish life in Helston. During the 1990s metal detecting was becoming increasingly popular in all parts of the country, and archaeologists were concerned that many significant finds were being dug up without being recorded with local museums or heritage bodies such as County Archaeological Units.

The Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) was founded in response to this problem in 1997, funded by a grant from the National Heritage Lottery Fund and managed under the auspices of the British Museum. Their first act was to recruit experienced people (called Finds Liaison Officers or FLOs) to liaise with detectorists in six selected areas and to encourage the voluntary recording of archaeological finds. The pilot proved highly effective and the scheme was rapidly expanded so that, by 2007, FLOs covered the whole of the country.

To date, over 1.5 million items have been recorded, from prehistoric worked flint to post-medieval dress accessories. All have been found by everyday people by chance, most through metal detecting. All the finds recorded by the Scheme are made publicly available on its online database and are helping to transform our understanding of Britain's past.

Laura is an archaeologist, educator and experimental ceramicist, graduating from University College Dublin with a MSc in Experimental Archaeology & Material Culture. Since then she has been pursuing research into Trevisker Ware giving lectures to several universities. She has worked in post-excavation for Cornwall Council, and in Royal Cornwall Museum as well as training to become a ceramics specialist.

Laura talked about finds from several eras including pottery, Bronze and Iron age tools, Roman coins and jewellery (especially brooches), medieval buckles and belts and horse equipment. There were 256 PAS records from Cornwall in just one year (2023) including red flints from the late mezolithic era (a beach find) stone tools(a hammerstone) metal tools (axeheads), and coins (Edward 1) plus a papal bulla from Pope Martin V (1417 to 1431).

Laura says if you find anything of historic interest, please do get it recorded, so they can update the database for everyone to enjoy, especially if you think it may qualify as Treasure. If you're not sure, you can check the Treasure Act guidance here:



'Stars in the Grass'

The life of Cornish Naturalist Frederick Hamilton Davey of Ponsanooth

Speaker: Keith Spurgin Emeritus Recorder for the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland, a Fellow of the Linnean Society and an Honorary Member of the Eden Florilegium. In 2016 he was awarded an MRes at Plymouth University for his study of bramble biometrics.



F.H. Davey was born at Ponsanooth in1868 and was to become perhaps Cornwall's most famous Naturalist having completed 'The Flora of Cornwall' which is recognised as the standard work, and is well illustrated throughout. He left school aged 11 to work in the Kennall Powder Mills but suffered bouts of ill health and used his convalescence to further his interest in nature. In 1891 aged 23 he submitted his first paper to the Cornwall Polytechnic Society. In 1900 he trained as a chemist and assayer at the Redruth School of Mines and succeeded his father as works manager of the Cornwall Arsenic Company at Bissoe. In 1911 he suffered a heart attack followed by a cerebral thrombosis which left him unable to speak for the remainder of his life. He died on 23 September 1915, and was buried in Ponsanooth.
